Summary of Subject:	As part of their controlled assessment, students will study a range of texts from prose to drama and from a variety of historical backgrounds. The examination requires students to analyse three media and non-fiction texts, detailing the effectiveness of aspects such as the writer's use of language and presentational features. Students must then create two pieces of descriptive and persuasive writing which demonstrate their own ability to target a specific audience and write for a specific purpose.	
Units and weighting:	Unit 1: 60% examination, media and non-fiction. Unit 3: 40% controlled assessment – 5 assessed pieces including modern prose and Shakespeare. Please note that Unit 2 (speaking and listening) no longer contributes to the overall grade a student receives and will be undertaken as an additional task only.
