

We are delighted to share that our pupils have made a fantastic start to the school year, diving straight into their learning with enthusiasm and curiosity.

So what are we investigating?

Year 7 has started to explore Christianity in Religious Education, the first step in a thorough exploration of faith and culture.

Year 8 has begun their adventure along "The Plastic Nile", learning about sustainability and plastic pollution.

Year 9 pupils have embarked on a fascinating study of history, learning about the Russian Revolution and its global impact.

We are incredibly proud of the progress pupils are making and look forward to supporting them in their journey this year!

# Let's Investigate!

So far this term in KS3, science pupils have been honing their scientific investigation skills. They have also been reviewing what they did in the previous Key Stage and looking at the impact of lifestyle on health and wellbeing.

It has been a very purposeful start to the year for WFA Science with classes working hard in lessons and a lot of pupils attending interventions before and after school.




# The Future Artists of Northampton
