## Re: Relationships and Sexual Health Education (RSHE)

I am writing to inform you about the Relationships and Sexual Health Education (RSHE) curriculum at Weston Favell Academy, in line with the statutory guidance from the Department for Education (DfE). As part of our commitment to providing a broad and balanced curriculum, we ensure that all pupils receive age-appropriate and evidence-based education on relationships, health and well-being.

From September 2020, the teaching of Relationships and Sexual Health Education (RSHE) became compulsory in all secondary schools in England. The curriculum aims to equip pupils with the knowledge and skills to form healthy relationships, understand consent and make informed decisions about their well-being. Topics covered include:

- Healthy relationships, including friendships and family dynamics
- Respect, equality and diversity
- · Online safety and media influence
- Sexual health, including contraception and STIs
- The importance of consent and personal boundaries
- The impact of relationships on mental and emotional well-being

All content is delivered in a sensitive and age-appropriate manner by trained staff, ensuring that pupils feel comfortable and supported in their learning.

## Parental Right to Withdraw

We acknowledge that some parents may have concerns about aspects of the RSHE curriculum. While parents have the right to request that their child be withdrawn from the sex education elements of RSHE (excluding those elements that are part of the science curriculum), we encourage discussions with the school before making any decisions.

Each year, we send a letter to all parents and carers asking if you wish to withdraw your child (years 8-11 only) from these specific sex education lessons. If you would like to withdraw your child, please submit a written request to Mr Beeby, Head of School at <a href="mailto:kbeeby@westonfavellacademy.org">kbeeby@westonfavellacademy.org</a>.
