ENGLISH LITERATURE

Literature Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th-century novel

What's assessed? Macbeth A Christmas Carol

How it's assessed

- written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes
- 64 marks
- 40% of GCSE

Questions

Section A Shakespeare: students will answer one question on their play of choice (Macbeth). They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.

Section B The 19th-century novel: students will answer one question on their novel of choice (A Christmas Carol). They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and continue the question focusing on the novel as a whole.

Literature Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

What's assessed? An Inspector Calls The Power and Conflict poetry anthology Unseen poetry

How it's assessed

- written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes
- 96 marks
- 60% of GCSE

Questions

Section A Modern texts: students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their studied drama text (An Inspector Calls).

Section B Poetry: students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from the Power and Conflict anthology.

Section C Unseen poetry: Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.

Revision support: Lunch time study and support sessions on a Monday and after school on a Tuesday. Class notes in folders, BBC Bite size, AQA revision guides.

How to help your child revise:

- Set aside specific times in the week to revise for History revision works best when it is part of their regular routine. Ensure that they have at least two revision slots in a week for History as it is very content heavy.
- Your child will be given a summary of the core content they need to know for each exam. Encourage your child to revise the topics they are *least* confident with.
- Set goals for their revision sessions e.g. 'By the end of today I'm going to be able to recall the main forms of law enforcement in medieval England'. After their session, ask them how they know they achieved their goal.
- Use the mark schemes on the Edexcel website to improve any exam questions they complete.


